The main purpose of this special issue is to encourage reflection and debate, theoretical and applied, about the impacts on the three pillars of sustainability (environmental, economic and social) of the accelerated processes of technological advancement, especially those linked to technologies of information and communication (TICs). We are specifically interested in reflections about the possibilities of public action to promote sustainable adaptation, through the formulation of public policies that are inclusive and respectful of the environment. The objective is to gather research that addresses the problem from a panoramic outlook, which requires a multidisciplinary approach to provide academicians and politician indications.

Academic papers dealing with sustainability in the knowledge society, in environmental fields, in the economy and in management, justice, history and education are welcome; nevertheless, any other proposed focus could be accepted. The content of this special issue will be of interest to academia, NGOs, policymakers and all those involved on socio-economic issues related to knowledge society and sustainability.

The issue will carry revised and substantially extended versions of selected papers presented at the [EDaSS VII International Conference](#), but we are also inviting other experts to submit articles for this call.
